



SAFETY HOUSE PROGRAM

The Safety House Program is a community based program to assist our children's safety when they are travelling to and from school. It greatly improves the chances of children finding a safe place and a caring person as quickly as possible in unsafe situations.

Through our approved education programs, children learn how to identify safe and unsafe situations and safe ways to travel to and from school. Children are encouraged to use a Safety House if they are:

- approached by someone who makes them feel unsafe
- bullied by other children
- seriously injured or hurt
- frightened by animals
- offered drugs
- lost
- ill.

The role of the Safety Householder is to comfort the child and if necessary contact the police.

We always need more residents to offer their homes as safety houses especially in the following streets – Stephen Avenue, Aileen Avenue, Summerhill Road & Currawong Road.

To become a Safety Householder you must normally be at home when children are travelling to and from school. You must also consent to having your personal details checked against police records.
